Graduate School of Law

[Master's Degree Program] [Ph.D. Degree Program] Law and Politics Major

The program offers three courses with a flexible and progressive curriculum: a Researcher Training Course aimed at training researchers, a High-quality Professional Research Course focused on developing highly specialized professionals, and an International Collaboration Course that provides instruction in English for international students admitted through special programs*. A flexible and progressive curriculum enables students to tailor their studies according to their interests and aspirations. Faculty members who are active across a wide range of fields provide personalized guidance to each student. The program offers an environment where students from diverse backgrounds, including not only graduates of the Faculty of Law but also working professionals and international students, can challenge and inspire one another as they pursue their research.

The program's curriculum spans both the training of specialized professionals and the development of researchers. International academic exchange is promoted through initiatives such as creating the Program for EU-Japanology Education and Research (PEJER) as a minor and implementing a double-degree program with Yeungnam University in South Korea. Since students are expected to publish papers in academic journals and present at academic conferences while enrolled in the graduate school, it's necessary to broaden their knowledge by including lectures from other programs in addition to their own specialization. This graduate school offers a diverse range of programs covering all fields of the humanities and provides detailed support for study and research.

Graduate School of Economics

[Master's Degree Program] [Ph.D. Degree Program] Economics Major

The Graduate School of Economics offers programs tailored to individual objectives. In the Master's Degree Program, there are two courses: the Researcher Training Course and the High-quality Professional Research Course. The Researcher Training Course is designed with a view to integrated education with the Ph.D. Degree Program, providing an educational program for developing independent researchers. Graduates of this course are exempt from the written examination for the Ph.D. Degree Program. The High-quality Professional Research Course aims to equip students with advanced specialized knowledge in economics and the ability to prepare research reports on topics of their individual choice. Both courses offer a wide range of subjects in three areas (economic theory, applied economics, and international/regional/historical thought) to accommodate the diverse career plans of students. The Ph.D. Degree Program aims to train researchers while focusing on the acquisition of a doctoral degree. The Graduate School of Economics implements a supervisory advisor system from the first year in all seminar courses, ensuring detailed educational and research guidance.

Graduate School of Business and Commerce

[Master's Degree Program] [Ph.D. Degree Program] Business and Commerce Major

This program strives to cultivate researchers and highly specialized professionals equipped with the theoretical knowledge, practical sense, critical thinking, analytical skills, and expressive abilities that the society of the future will demand. The Researcher Training and Doctoral Program Preparation Course offers a curriculum centered on seminars to help students acquire analytical frameworks and research methodologies, while the Advanced Professional Training Course provides a curriculum featuring numerous lectures by experienced practitioners, designed to develop highly specialized professionals with sharp real-world awareness, flexible thinking skills, and advanced expertise demanded by modern society. In addition, we have established the DS Program aimed at training data scientists and the Tax & Accounting Strategy Program aimed at training tax accountants and personnel who will play an active role in the tax and finance departments of companies. In the 2026 academic year, we have launched the Doctoral GDS (Global Data Science) Program. Starting in the 2027 academic year, a new Entrepreneurship Management Program will be launched, aiming to cultivate social entrepreneurs and entrepreneurs who strive to balance addressing societal issues with business.

Graduate School of Sociology

[Master's Degree Program] [Ph.D. Degree Program]

Sociology Major / Social System Design Major / Media Studies Major

Reflecting its goal of cultivating specialists equipped with advanced creative abilities and independent initiative, the program offers courses that encompass both theoretical and practical perspectives. After completing the program, many graduates pursue careers as researchers at universities and research institutes, schoolteachers, or national and local public servants, and in recent years, an increasing number have been finding employment in private companies as well. Both the master's and doctoral programs actively accept international students and working professionals as they work to promote highly specialized research at a diverse and internationally competitive level.

Graduate School of Informatics

[Master's Degree Program] Social Informatics Major / Intelligent Informatics Major

[Ph.D. Degree Program] Informatics Major

The master's program aims to train information specialists with advanced expertise and has established two majors: Social Informatics and Intelligent Informatics. The curriculum adopts an innovative style in which graduate students conduct collaborative research on the latest issues, such as the information society and advanced technologies. For its part, the doctoral program aims to develop information pioneers in the field of information sciences and has established an Informatics Major that integrates the humanities and sciences.

Graduate School of Foreign Language Education and Research

[Master's Degree Program] [Ph.D. Degree Program]

Foreign Language Education and Research Major

This graduate school specializes in training foreign language professionals and experts in foreign language education. The master's program offers three areas of study: Foreign Language Teaching, which focuses on systematic and comprehensive learning applicable to practice; Intercultural Communication Studies, which explores topics through an interdisciplinary approach; and Interpreting and Translation Studies, which pursues both practice and education. The doctoral program focuses on the full-scale development of researchers in foreign language education. The school also promotes international academic exchange through initiatives such as a double-degree program with Yeungnam University in South Korea and Aston University in the United Kingdom.

Composed of three majors and their respective fields, the master's program is dedicated to cultivating highly skilled engineers who will contribute to the advancement of our science- and technology-oriented society in the future. Students develop a broad base of knowledge, logical thinking skills, and the ability to identify and solve scientific and technological challenges within each field based on scientific reasoning. The program also promotes international education through initiatives such as English-based courses and double-degree programs with overseas universities. The doctoral program consists of a single major, Integrated Science and Engineering, allowing students to receive guidance from multiple faculty members across different fields.

Graduate School of Psychology

[Master's Degree Program] Psychology Major / Clinical Psychology Major

[Ph.D. Degree Program] Psychology Major

The Psychology Major offers a comprehensive education based on five areas (Cognitive and Physiological Psychology, Social and Industrial Psychology, Developmental and Educational Psychology, Health and Personality Psychology, and Quantitative and Methodological Psychology) with a strong emphasis on developing research skills and fostering individuals capable of contributing to solving various issues in the field. The Clinical Psychology Major is designed to train professionals who can actively work as licensed psychologists. In addition to developing practical skills, the curriculum is designed to foster the ability to apply scientifically grounded practices and to equip students with research skills necessary for research and development in clinical psychology and related fields.

Graduate School of Societal Safety Sciences

[Master's Degree Program] [Ph.D. Degree Program] Disaster Prevention and Reduction Major

To realize a safe and secure society, it's necessary to establish a new interdisciplinary field of social safety studies that integrates the humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences. This graduate school is committed to accumulating and systematizing safety-related knowledge while fostering the ability to explore disaster prevention and mitigation measures, accident prevention, and crisis management through multifaceted and comprehensive approaches, and to create theories and policies. Additionally, the school has also established an English-taught doctoral program, the Ph.D. of Disaster Management (PDM) Program.

Graduate School of East Asian Cultures

[Master's Degree Program] [Ph.D. Degree Program] Cultural Interaction Studies

Under the Department of Cultural Interaction Studies, three domains of study (East Asian Languages and Visual Representation, East Asian Thought and Organization, and East Asian History and Dynamics) have been established to explore the diverse forms of cultural exchange and interaction in the region with the goal of becoming an international research hub for East Asian culture. Additionally, while promoting international academic exchange through initiatives such as the East Asia Next-Generation Forum, where graduate students from Japan, China, and South Korea present their research findings, and a double-degree program with Yeungnam University in Korea, the program cultivates methods for comprehending the entirety of cultural interaction in East Asia and fosters perspectives that recognize East Asia as a chain of diverse cultural contacts that transcend national borders.

Graduate School of Governance

[Master's Degree Program] [Ph.D. Degree Program] Governance Major

The program aims to cultivate highly skilled public professionals with the ability to identify issues, design policies as solutions, and implement them. Education and research are carried out with a focus on law, political science, public administration, economics, and business administration, fostering collaboration across these disciplines. Students address issues such as regional environmental development, the socioeconomic advancement of Asian societies, and regional revitalization policies as they engage in interdisciplinary and multifaceted learning while tackling more practical policy challenges.

Graduate School of Health and Well-being

[Master's Degree Program] [Ph.D. Degree Program] Health and Well-being Major

This graduate school goes beyond the traditional focus on improving athletic performance, which has been the main objective of physical education and sports research institutions, and places emphasis on research and practice aimed at promoting human health and well-being through physical activity, sports, and social work in welfare. This policy of the graduate school aligns with the ideals of the Health Promotion Act, the Basic Act on Sport, the Social Welfare Act, and other legislation, and it aims to realize health and well-being in local communities from the two perspectives of sports and social work. This graduate school cultivates individuals who can build social capital through sports and social work and foster the practice of health promotion and health and welfare support projects. The goal is to train highly specialized teachers who can demonstrate leadership in educational settings with specialized teaching licenses for health and physical education in junior and senior high schools, as well as highly skilled professionals in related fields, and to produce leaders in civic activities such as NPOs and NGOs. At the same time, this graduate school cultivates researchers possessing an interdisciplinary perspective and practical skills necessary for leading the way in addressing societal challenges.

School of Law

Three-year program for students with a non-law background / Two-year program for students with a law background

Established in April 2004, the program is designed to train legal professionals with a pronounced sense of humanity and commitment to address contemporary social issues. It produces legal experts who balance theory and practice, possess outstanding human rights awareness, demonstrate creativity in responding appropriately to emerging issues, and are capable of leading the evolving legal society with a global perspective.

School of Accountancy

(School of Accountancy Accountant Training Major)

As accounting and auditing systems are being revised to meet global standards, Japan's certified public accountants are increasingly expected to perform at an international level. The primary mission of our School of Accountancy is to cultivate accounting professionals who are well-versed in both theory and practice and capable of succeeding on the world stage.

Eligibility for applicants (September applications • November applications)

All conditions (1) to (4) below must be met to apply for the entrance examination.

- (1) Applicants who must be of foreign nationality.
- (2) Applicants who satisfy any one of conditions [1] through [6] below and who have completed at least two-thirds of a 12-year curriculum in a country other than Japan (see Note 1), or applicants who satisfy condition [7] below
 Note 1: Applicants who attended a foreign school in Japan or a Japanese school program in another country will be treated as if they had attended school in Japan for the duration of their enrollment. Students who graduated from a high school or secondary school in Japan only (or who expect to do so) are not eligible to take the examination.
 [1] Applicants who have completed a 12-year schooling as part of a normal curriculum in a country other than Japan, or who expect to have done so by March 31, 2027
 Note 2: Meaning applicants who have studied in a country other than Japan for at least two-thirds of the total period of 12 years, less the period shortened due to grade-skipping or otherwise. This includes those who completed the 12th year of a program in less than 12 years by skipping grades, or otherwise.
 [2] Applicants who have passed an examination in another country that certifies them as having knowledge equivalent to someone who has completed a 12-year educational curriculum in that country (including examinations that satisfy national standards) and who will be 18 years of age by March 31, 2027
 [3] Applicants who have completed the secondary curriculum in a country that does not require 12 years of study and who have completed a course designed to prepare students for admission to a Japanese university as designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, or who expect to have done so by March 31, 2027
 Note 3: Meaning applicants who spent at least two-thirds of the duration of their secondary education outside Japan.
 [4] Applicants who have completed a program of study at a school equivalent to high school that qualifies as the equivalent of at least 11 years of education as designated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology in a country other than Japan, or who expect to have done so by March 31, 2027
 Note 4: Meaning applicants who spent at least two-thirds of the duration of their study in a high-school-equivalent program outside Japan.
 [5] Applicants who have earned an internationally recognized qualification that entitles them to attend university (International Baccalaureate, Abitur, Baccalaureate, GCEA level, International A-levels, European Baccalaureate) in a country other than Japan
 [6] Applicants who have completed a 12-year program of study at an educational facility in a country other than Japan that has earned certification for educational and related activities from an international evaluation organization (WASC, CIS, ACSI, NEASC, Cognia, COBIS)
 [7] Applicants who have been certified by the University's Undergraduate Faculty Council as having qualifications equivalent or superior to those described in conditions [1] through [6] above, and who will be 18 years of age by March 31, 2027

(3) Applicants who have taken one of the EJU* subjects designated by each faculty in one of the examinations designated by each faculty.

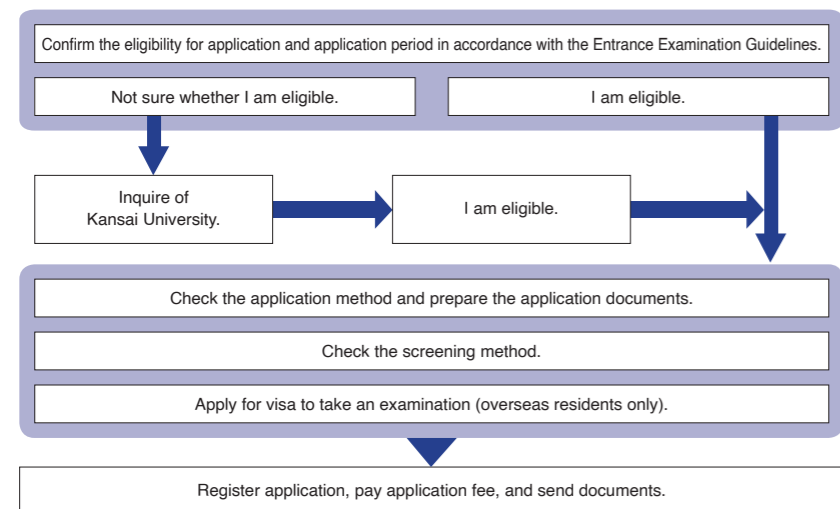

- Applicants who satisfy any of the following conditions.
 - Applicants who have completed a regular 14-year schooling in foreign countries. (Applicants expecting adequate qualifications by the end of March, 2027 are eligible).
 - Applicants who will have been registered at a four-year university in Japan for at least two years by the end of March 2027 (excluding periods of leave of absence) and have obtained at least 60 of the credits required for graduation from the faculty and department concerned (including applicants expecting adequate qualifications).
 - Graduates of a four-year university, junior college or tertiary college in Japan (Applicants expecting adequate qualifications by the end of March 2027 are eligible).
 - Students who have completed a specialized course at a special training school in Japan (Applicants expecting adequate qualifications by the end of March 2027 are eligible).
 - Others who are recognized to have academic ability equivalent to or greater than that above by the President after discussion in the Faculty Council.
- Applicants who have taken the "Japanese as a Foreign Language (including writing task)" examination in the Examination for Japanese University Admission for International Students (EJU) or obtained Level N1 of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT).

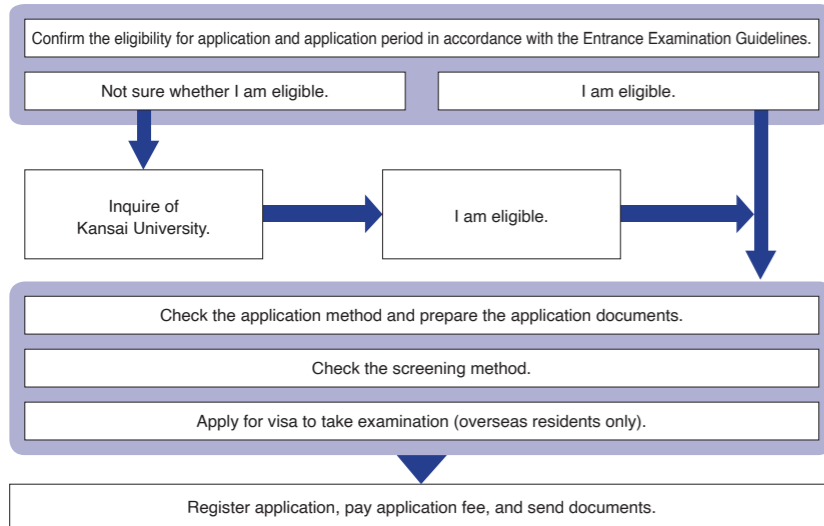

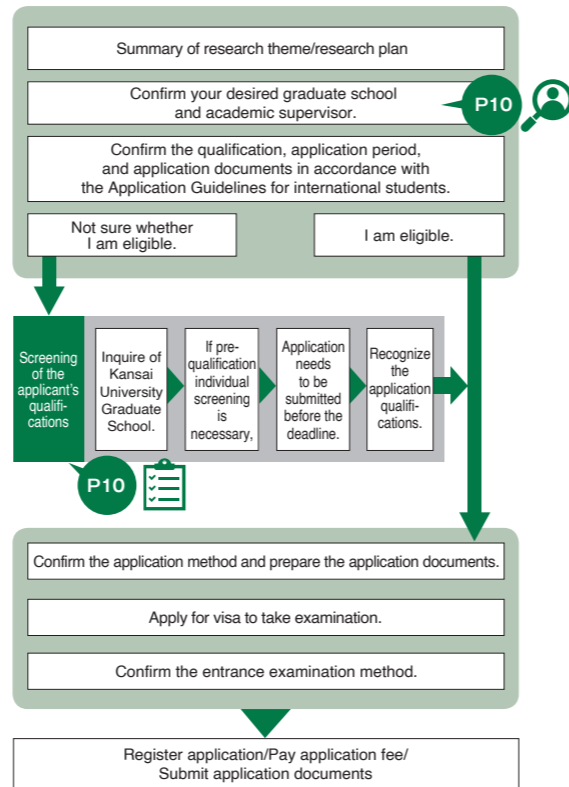

Foreign Research Student Program

This program is targeted at foreign students who have their own research theme and wish to receive research guidance from a specific graduate school before enrolling Kansai University Graduate school. Although Foreign Research Student is not an official student of Kansai University, a certain number of credits they obtain may be recognized as advanced credits after enrolling if they complete subjects specified by the graduate school and pass their examinations.

Eligibility for applicants

The application qualifications for the **master's course** on page 8 apply. In addition, the applicant must have the consent of the faculty member from whom he or she wishes to receive guidance and must have the Japanese language ability specified by the Graduate School.

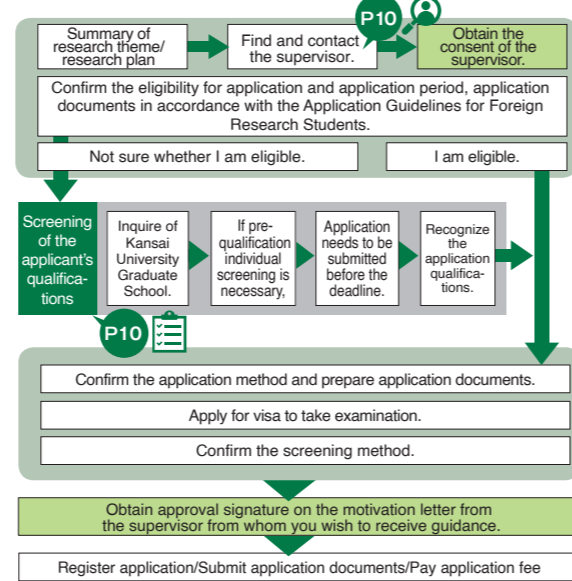

Scholarships from outside sources (awarded based on an open application process)

Outside foundations award these scholarships to students who have applied on their own. The University can provide information about some, while other students must research on their own.

Third-year student in a Ph.D. Degree Program of the Graduate School of Informatics

Yang Liheng Country/region: China

One of Kansai University's strengths is that it provides an environment where international students can study and take on challenges with ease. The faculty and staff are also very supportive; when we give presentations in Japanese, instructors carefully review and correct the content, and when I encounter difficulties in daily life, the administrative staff offer considerate support, which I find very reassuring. In addition, I think the opportunity to meet many students from diverse backgrounds is also a strength.

At the Graduate School of Informatics, I'm conducting research on human-robot interaction. For instance, I explore how people perceive and understand robots and what kinds of impressions they get from them. So, the contents I work on are highly engaging. Studying the topic from both engineering and humanities perspectives allows me to deepen my understanding of technology and human beings at the same time, which I find especially compelling.

In extracurricular activities, I actively participate in exchanges and information-sharing among international students. Kansai University offers an international exchange program called the Global Buddy Program. In this program, Kansai University students serve as buddies for exchange students, by easing the uncertainties and concerns they may have before and after arriving in Japan (for instance, things related to daily customs, rules, or making friends) so they can have a fulfilling study abroad experience. Through this experience, I've been able to meet international students from a wide range of countries and regions. Interacting with students from different cultural and intellectual backgrounds has broadened my perspective and provided me with valuable inspiration.

I'm a recipient of the Kansai University Graduate School Special Benefit Scholarship. Being able to use this scholarship to cover part of my tuition, I can focus on my research while reducing financial concerns.

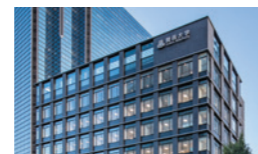

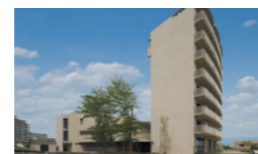

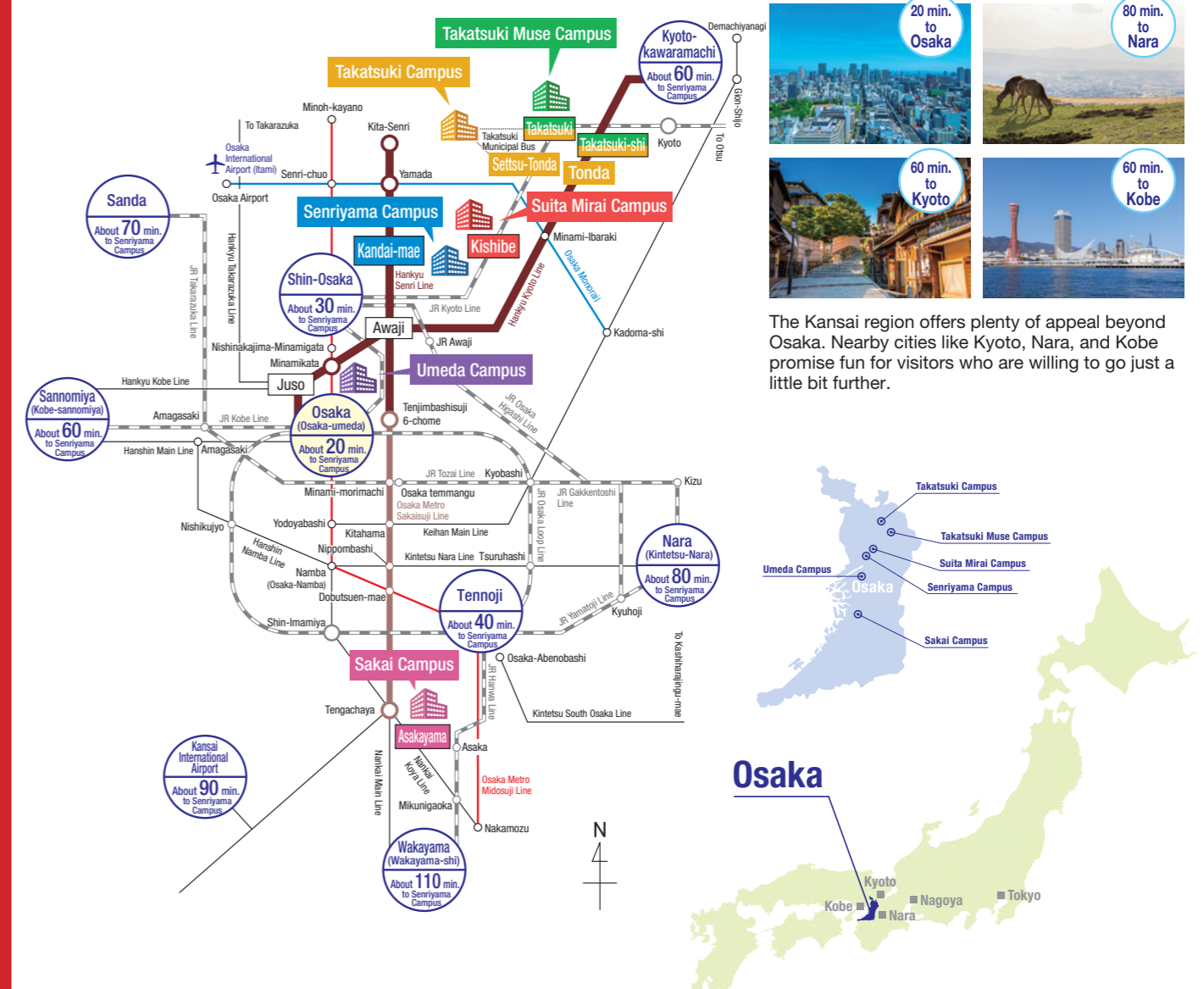
